when he was 12, and now he was ready for baptism. There was a baptism in a church in Kyiv, where there was a joint baptism for several churches. But he wanted to be baptized at his own church, so that neighbors could come, as well as his mother and stepfather. Maybe this testimony will prompt his mother to return to the church and to Christ.

I want to tell about the ministry we've here in the month of September.

The whole world is aware of the military conflict in Ukraine, which has been going on for almost five years. This has brought many troubles and griefs to the Ukrainian people, especially to those who have seen their relatives and loved ones sent to the east of Ukraine to defend their native land. There are so many, because they were summoned for this business from every city and village of Ukraine! Some went voluntarily, hoping that something would change in our country and that everyone would live better. But it's been a long time and everything continues as it was; people are accustomed to the fact that every day someone dies, someone gets crippled, someone disappears, etc.

This distress has not overlooked our Zdolbuniv district, our villages and the homes of our countrymen. Many young boys have been sent off to war. There have been many prayers for those who went to exercise their military duty. As time passed, many have returned to their families, but there are others who did not return themselves. They were returned home dead. There are 12 such people in our district. We decided to visit their families, to sympathize with them, to pray with them, to help them. We took along grocery packages, plus Christian literature, and went to visit these people.

For some, a lot of time has passed, almost five years, and the wounds still have not healed. Having visited these families, we realized that it is possible for them to be comforted by God, and we



tried to tell them about Him. It is very noticeable that their hearts are ready for a word of comfort, but at the same time they had lost hope for something good. Therefore, the support that we provided caused them great gratitude; it reminded them that God loves and them.
