On the day before Christmas we visited an assisted nursing home for elderly people. We wished to bring a holiday mood to lonely individuals. And not only a good mood, but also to show them some

We are accustomed to ministering to children with our puppet theater; therefore, when we arrived at the home for the elderly, we were a bit doubtful concerning how people of such a respectable age would receive our presentation.
