The Rehabilitation Center

Despite all the difficulties of serving people with addictions, we see how God blesses this work and people's lives are changing. There is even one brother who was baptized. A lot of people call and ask about entering the rehab center, but we don't have enough space. In the house where the rehabilitants live, there is nowhere to put beds. We are grateful to God that this ministry is bearing fruit.



The Church

During the war, many people have left Desna. But God draws to the church those who are being saved. Many new people have begun attending the church. There are repentances, and people are drawn to God. Like never before, the church is a good testimony and people have become more friendly. Although there are constant sirens warning of rocket attacks, people still come to services regularly. Often, we have just started church services when the alarm sounds, and I say those who

are worried can go to a safe place. Well, people remain to sit and pray for God's protection.

The Pastor

We work a lot with you [at BIEM], helping different categories of people. Our help starts with groceries and ends with medicine for military personnel. We provide both medicines and other things that can save the life of a wounded person. We have a need for tourniquets, and God has blessed us so that we can distribute them to soldiers who are on the front line, where there is a fight for the life of a soldier who has just been wounded. We help those who are without



insulin and have various heart diseases. Our help varies, but the goal is to help people and testify about God. Telling people that God loves them. And throughout the war our work was noticed more than once, both by the military and our government. On the Harvest holiday we as a church and personally I as a pastor received a certificate expressing gratitude for our help and service to people. This is a credit to all of us;

without your support we would not have been able to achieve these results. Well, you and I know that we are all laboring for the glory of our Lord and for the spread of His kingdom.

Gone to war

Despite the war in Ukraine, we continue the ministry of rehabilitation. Currently we have 11 people, all with different problems. One rehabilitant has a nephew named Bogdan, a young guy not even 30 years old who wants to be drafted into the army and go to war. He tried to enlist in his hometown. It's not entirely clear for what reasons, but he didn't succeed. His uncle Sergei, being here for rehabilitation, agreed to help him come here to Desna and from here to get him into the army.

When Bogdan arrived and settled into the rehabilitation center, he began to implement his plan for conscription into the army. Everyone talked to him about this. He is patriotic, which we could not help but rejoice at. Yet, our understanding is that a person must decide the most crucial thing in this life, which is an important matter concerning one's soul. A person needs to be reconciled with God. From the first day, we began witnessing to Bogdan about God. At first, he

looked at us in great surprise, not quite understanding what was happening. We told him, "Understand that God has a plan for your life and that God brought you to the rehab enter because He wants to tell you something important." Everyone testified to Bogdan, and he heard the call of God and agreed to repent and accept Jesus as his Savior. We couldn't be happier because there's no greater joy than to see a person get saved.

Bogdan says, "I see how God miraculously brought me to a rehabilitation center, where I could be saved. I'm ready to accept God's plan and stay with you to grow in God. And for about a month, Bogdan has been living at the rehab center and studying the Word of God, praying, attending services and small groups studying the Word of God. We all see how God is changing his life amazingly, and it encourages us so much. We see God's amazing work, how God uses different situations and saves people. Bogdan left home to go to war, but God worked so that he came to us, where he accepted Christ. When you look at the journey Bogdan made, from another city, he came to us with his own ideas, but here God had a plan for his salvation.
