ear friends, brothers and sisters. There's a war going on in our country, and many people wake up every morning to the sound of a siren warning of danger (the need to seek shelter). Many people don't wake up at all. Yet, amidst this difficult military and economic time, the Lord gave us a great blessing—an opportunity to hold a children's camp for five days. About eighty children attended. When the war began, our church had eighteen Sunday school teachers. That number dropped to three. The others left the country for their own safety, and this greatly affected the children's ministry.

However, the Lord made it so that there were no hostilities in our area. Many of the teachers even returned home, so we prayed about holding a children's camp. And God gave us such an opportunity. From July 19 to 24, we held a blessed time for the children, when they could get out of their homes and spend time in nature. There, instead of hearing sirens, they could forget about war and simply enjoy fellowshipping with other children.

This was the first time we've held such a camp on land we purchased for church use. Of course, the territory needed much preparation for camping. For example, we needed to equip this property with everything necessary (toilets, summer showers, a place for washing hands, a dining area, a place for tents, a sports field, a bonfire ring, benches for seating, etc.) We accomplished all this thanks to the sacrifice of brothers who worked tirelessly for nearly a month *continued on page 3*

Freed from a Demon

BIEM received this brief message from one of our missionaries in Central Asia, a predominantly Muslim area: "Azamat got called into the police again. Please have people praying for him." We quickly posted that prayer request on our Facebook page. Later, we received this update: "I just heard from Azamat, He was questioned for an hour and a half as to why he is a Christian. For an hour of that time, he clearly shared the Gospel with them! They basically then laughed and said all their friends were in hell, and so that's where they want to go. Azamat told them he would pray for them. He was released and said he believes they will continue calling him in on a regular basis to try to play psychological games with him. He said, "I'll keep sharing Jesus with them."

One year ago, we could not have imagined that God would give us the opportunity and resources to start a Bible Institute in Central Asia. This institute is especially for young Afghanis who escaped the Taliban and have become believers in Christ through the evangelistic outreach of our Tajik team. This is a nearly unbelievable opportunity for them. They are Muslim refugees who heard the Gospel and became believers at great risk to their own safety.

The first session covered Christ in the Old Testament, Motivational Lessons from Joshua (taught by Tim* from BIEM), and Biblical History by our national team leader, Evangelist Richard*. The students were a mix of men and women from three different Afghan groups. The women were delighted they had the freedom to participate as they added insight and laughter to the discussions. What a contrast to their former lives. When Tim was teaching about serving the Lord from the book of Joshua, the young men exclaimed, "We go, we go!" They were willing to become church planters among the refugees in Central Asia, or even go back to Afghanistan if God called them there. This willingness is courageous since Afghanis (and particularly any who are Christian), once they are deported back to Afghanistan

Only God could make all of this happen, and we know it is for His glory! in throughout the camp's Bible lessons, games, clubs, and other activities. The children slept in tents all five nights. We had prepared a tent town for them in advance. We started each new day of camp with prayer, where we thanked God for His protection and asked for blessings on the new day. And every day, all adults and children saw this blessing sent to us by a loving Father. After prayer, we ate breakfast, then had a Bible study.

Every day, the children had time to use their own hands to make a clock, which they got to keep as a memento. On the clocks were written the wonderful words, "A time for everything." The games we played each day were also important for the children. Gametime was a wonderful opportunity for them to exercise their physical, mental, and logical powers. Every day, the children learned Christian songs, and every evening we sang praise to God with them during the camp meeting.

Also, each child had opportunities throughout the day to earn points, which they could then exchange for virtual funds to spend on the last day in the store organized by the teachers. They could buy various books, hygiene products, stationery, toys, and other items that might interest them if they had enough funds. Every evening there was a meeting where the children could praise God. They prepared in groups to participate in the meetings. Also, at each meeting they heard a sermon on the lesson topic that the teachers had taught in the morning. The camp was a wonderful, God-blessed time for the children, their parents, and all the camp organizers!

I would like to sincerely thank the BIEM mission, which has supported us financially during this difficult time.
